
## PERAMBULATION OF THE LINES BETWEEN THE TOWNS OF NEWFIELDS AND EPPING, NEW HAMPSHIRE

Agreeable to notice given the Town of Epping by the Towns of Newmarket and Newfields, we the Selectmen of said Towns, met on the 17th day of December, 1995, at 10:00 in the AM at Epping, on Jacob's Well Road, for the purpose of perambulating the lines between the said Towns of Newfields and Epping, and renewing marks and bounds according to law.

Beginning at a stone monument marked "N", "E" and "SN" (South Newmarket now Newfields), at the Northwest bounds of the Towns of Newmarket, Epping and Newfields in the woods about 1,000 ft. off of Jacob's Well Road. Said woods now belonging to the Limperis Farm, traveling due South 180 degrees about 1 mile, more or less, to State Highway Route 87, Piscassic Road, on the North side, a stone monument, marked "E" and "SN", the western bound of Newfields and the eastern of Epping. Still traveling due South 750 feet, more or less, to Mast Road and an iron pipe on each side of subject Road. Again traveling due South 695 feet, more or less, to the Concord-Portsmouth railroad track bed, then continuing 525 feet due South to a Beaver Swamp, with a large stone monument, marked "B", "E", "E" and "SN" (for the corners of Exeter), Epping and Newfields, which is about 100 feet also from the boundary of Brentwood, which is on the south side of the Piscassic River, in the woods off of Birch Road.

Dear Mr. Snider,

We are in receipt of your letter dated November 7, 2001 with regard to scheduling a date for the Boards of Selectmen for Newfields and Stratham to meet to perambulate our mutual town boundary. As you pointed out, the Squamscott River defines this boundary so there is little need to physically meet to traverse this landmark. By this letter, we are acknowledging and reaffirming that the centerline of the Squamscott River represents the shared boundary between our two towns starting at the point where the town boundaries of Exeter, Newfields, and Stratham meet and ending at the point downstream where the town boundaries of Newfields, Newmarket, and Stratham meet at, just beyond, or near the Boston & Maine Railroad trestle.

## TOWN OF EXETER – TOWN OF NEWFIELDS PERAMBULATION

Persuant to a notice by the Selectmen's Agent of the Town of Newfields, the undersigned met at the Town bound on the westerly side of Newfields Road (also known as Exeter Road and NH Route 85) at nine thirty a.m. on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of November, 2001, and proceeded to perambulate the lines between said towns and to renew marks and bounds thereof and established the same as follows:

Beginning at a point on the center line of the Squamscott River, N 63° W to a stone monument marked "E" and "SN" (Exeter and South Newmarket, now Newfields) on the edge of the marsh; thence S 50° W 400 feet; thence S 49° W 200 feet; thence N 75° W, 600 feet to the B & M Railroad bed; thence continuing 1,200 feet in the same direction to a field stone and stone monument marked "E" and "SN" on the westerly side of Route 85; thence S 68° W, 375 feet along a stone wall to a field stone marked "B" in the corner of the wall; thence N 42° W, 800 feet to a stone monument marked "E" and "SN" in a swamp; thence S 51° W, 1,000 feet to a stone monument marked "E" and "SN"; thence N 44° W, 2,400 feet to a stone marked "E" and "N"; thence N 40° E, 400 feet along a stone wall to a field stone and stone monument, both marked "E" and "SN"; thence N 63° W, 1,200 feet to a small stone marked "N" near the telephone cable line (not found); continuing in the same direction 2,600 feet to a field stone marked "E" and "SN" on the westerly side of Oaklands Road; continuing in the same direction 6,275 feet to a field stone marked "E" and "SN" on the westerly side of Cuba (also known as Cubie) Road; continuing in the same direction 5,200 feet to a stone monument in the swamp marked "E" and "SN" and "E", the bound of Exeter, Newfields and Epping. <sup>^</sup> and "B"

We, the undersigned, have this day perambulated the Town Lines from bound to bound and find them correct.
